Keeping rules and regulations in the UK in line with those in the European Union after Brexit, as in "regulatory alignment".

Definition:

Short for those who are in favour of Brexit.

Definition:

Means the UK leaving the European Union and cutting ties immediately, with no agreement in place. If MPs do not approve a deal, the UK will leave with no deal on 31 October. The UK would follow World Trade Organization rules to trade with the EU.

Definition:

The transition period is intended to allow time for the UK and EU to agree their future relationship. The UK would have no say in the making of new EU laws during the transition but would have to follow all EU rules, including freedom of movement.

Definition:

A bus hired by the Leave campaign. On its side was a slogan that became one of the most controversial of the campaign and was credited by some with swinging the result: "We send the EU £350m a week. Let's fund our NHS instead."

There are no physical barriers or checks on people or goods crossing the border between Northern Ireland and Ireland. The backstop would keep the UK inside the EU's customs union without a deal because no one wants a new physical barrier.

Word Juggle

Definition:

A phrase used to mean that Britain is trying to retain all the benefits of European Union membership without the obligations, including payments to the EU budget, accepting the European Court of Justice and accepting the free of movement of people.

Word Juggle

Definition:

Part of an EU treaty that sets out how member countries can leave, with a two-year timetable for leaving. Article 50 was triggered by Prime Minister Theresa May at the end of March 2017 and means the UK will leave the EU at the end of October 2019.

Word Juggle

Definition:

Some campaigners - who call their proposal the People's Vote - want to have another referendum on the UK's membership of the EU. Opponents of another vote say there is no need for it as the 2016 referendum made it clear that people wanted to leave.

The day when the UK leaves the European Union, initially set for 29 March 2019 and now 31 October 2019, but subject to change by agreement with the EU.
